Safety Tips--Crank it up By Joe Siddons

While it it may be a bit easier to use a separate hand crank to start our engines that did not come with cranks built in, it is not recommended that you do so. As it is too easy once the engine starts running or kicks back to have the crank catch on the crank shaft and go flying off or worse come off and hit you or someone else and potentially cause serious damage, as happened some years ago. So if you are having problems with starting your engine at a show ask any club member and they will be glad to help you with pulling on the flywheels.

This old iron By Bob Smith

My article this month is on Ron Haskell's 1916 5HP Frisco Standard built by the Standard Gas Engine Co. of San Francisco, CA. The engine was purchased by Mike McKinney from a gentleman in San Francisco who had done major repair work due to salt damage. He had the cylinder re-bored and installed a new piston and new valves. He also had many of the parts nickel plated. Then displayed it for a few years, it then got set aside, dried out and cracked again. He gave up and sold it to Mike. Mike did not fix this damage and sold it to Ron 4 years ago. Ron repaired the cylinder and made a new muffler. The engine ran but was very erratic. Ron replaced the carburetor and it runs great now. Ron has no knowledge as to where the engine originally came from or what boat it operated. I am sure there was some old vessel on dry land that rotted around the engine. The wood is gone but the engine survived.
