Some time ago, Tom and Leroy worked on this machine and got it running on gasoline but it would not switch over to diesel. Other members looked at it and determined that the injector pump was bad, and since they are not available any more, we let it sit.

Three weeks ago, Tom decided to go back to trying to get it running so he took the carburetor home and cleaned it up and unstuck the float. We mounted it and got it running again on gasoline.

Last week Leroy started to troubleshoot the diesel and discovered the diesel pump was not working so we removed it after taking off the filters and starter to get to it. Leroy cleaned it up and got it working properly, then we installed it along with the filters and starter.

We started it on gasoline and warmed it up. The diesel fuel pump was working and filled the filters and we had pressure at the injector pump but no fuel to the injectors. Next week we will take the cover off the injector pump and see if everything is working inside. Things may be stuck since there is no oil in the injector pump. Stay tuned and we will keep you informed as to our progress.


