Fort MacArthur was a former Army post which protected the California coast line with two large 14" guns. We will be displaying our engines and tractors. As special guests of the museum we will have a tour to see the workings of this old Army post. Most of the museum is housed underground in a huge "bunker" complete with barracks, kitchen facilities, and a power generation facility. The museum personnel will fire up the large engine that was used to power the Fort with its enormous search lights. The museum will provide lunch.

Fort MacArthur is high above the Pacific Ocean. With the weather sweltering hot we will be able to enjoy the cool breezes off of the ocean. Our area is under large trees with ample parking for all trucks and trailers. Don't miss this show; it is a great opportunity to share our love of old iron and to visit a great old Army fort.

Take the 110 freeway to the end in San Pedro, and then Gaffey almost to the end. Just after 36th Street there will be signs instructing you to turn right into the museum. Then just follow the signs.

We still need to get out to Don Young's place and get the drill press he donated, along with other treasures he wants WAPA to have. I will try and give a heads up on that if any of you would like to help out.

My Sattley “The Painting”: Part 6 By Bob Smith

Now what color should I paint this engine? I looked on the internet and found all colors for this engine. It looked like the restorer painted it whatever color he wanted or had available. After seeing Mike Jones’ Sattley, I decided to paint mine brown. It looked to be that of the few engines and articles I saw on-line, the ‘Hit N Miss’ version was red and the throttle governed engines were brown. Since I don’t have a paint booth, I had to use the next best thing; my back yard.



The only drawback from that is falling leaves from trees and flying bugs getting into your paint job. I wouldn’t paint a nice car this way but for an old engine, it will do just fine. I positioned the large parts so I could get a good 360 degree access to all sides and hung all the small parts from my ladder. After all parts were painted it was time for assembly. Everything was put together based on the pictures I took prior to disassembly and some from memory. Care was taken to not scratch the new paint. Once the engine was fully assembled it was time for the initial startup. Gas in the tank. Starting fluid in the combustion chamber. Now a few pulls of the flywheels and presto, it runs. A few adjustments and the engine runs but not great. It is time to take it to a couple of shows and get advice from some of the seasoned members. It was so good to have such knowledgeable members to help you with your project. After the Marina del Rey show all I need to do is put an advance/retard lever on the mag trip lever. This large engine is hard to start in the “run” position. It wants to kick in the reverse direction unless you give it a good spin. Come check it out at one of our shows.

WAPA has been asked to join South Pasadena and participate in their 13th Annual Cruz’n For Roses Car Show on Sunday, September 17, 2017. It is a fund raising event for their Rose Parade Float. We will be on Mission Street at Fremont Ave on the south west corner.

When: September 17, 2017, Sunday morning set-up beginning at 6:30 am with the show ending at 3 pm. Unload and park by 7:30 am and then setup your exhibit for a 10 am show time.

Parking will be on the streets nearby. Bring your own food, water and shade. There is a Carrow’s Restaurant across the street from our exhibit.

How to get there: From the 210 Freeway, east or west in Pasadena, exit on Fair Oaks South and go through Pasadena and over the hill and then over the Pasadena Freeway, past Mission and turn right on El Centro St. Go west to Fremont and turn right, traveling north to Mission. We will be on your left on the south side of Mission at Fremont. Like last year, the car show is going to go east on Mission and continue to Fair Oaks but no closure of Fremont Ave. Do not block the street during setup.

**Marina del Rey Show Report

On Sunday, July 23, 2017, WAPA joined the Classic Yacht Association in celebrating their 41st Old Fashioned Day in the Park at Burton Chace Park in Marina del Rey. We have been doing this show since at least 1990. Normally we set up in front of the Helmsman Statue, but this year was different. There was a large commercial canopy setup for the park's concert series. After some discussion we decided to setup under the canopy with the engines facing north on the roadway. Under the canopy was black plastic carpeting. The area was large enough that smaller vehicles parked inside. We had a lot of room. The larger trucks parked inside the park at the service road turn around on the north side. WAPA members participating were Merle Morse showing a model hot air engine. Ron Haskell ran his 1 1/2 hp 1919 Fairbanks Morse engine and he had the pedal power water pump using a stationary exercise bike. The public enjoyed trying it out. Danny Ponce exhibited a Frisco Standard 4 hp marine engine. Ken and Larry Evans had their 1 3/4 hp Associated air cooled engine belted to the Duro water pump that never filled or emptied the catch bucket with fluid only running into it. Bob Smith brought his recently restored 5 hp Sattley and after retarding the timing we got it running without it kicking back at us. He is to fabricate a spark retard system. And to round out the display, Lance and Stephanie Wilson with Tim Neely ran a 1 1/2 hp Fairbanks Morse headless engine. Thank you all for coming and continuing to support this show at the cool ocean environment.
