

Tractor Rescue By Bob Smith

A year ago Gil Stewart donated a 1940 Minneapolis-Moline UTS to WAPA. We tried to sell it at last year's fun day at Larry's but there were no takers. I talked to Ron and we decided to move it to Cal Poly to work on. When Gil rescued this tractor several years ago he and his brother were going to restore it. They started by dismantling it and found the engine in bad shape. He had the head reworked and the block bored and sleeved. Other projects took priority and the tractor sat idle.

Last month Ron and I went out to Gil's house in Moreno Valley to see what it would take to move the dismantled tractor. Ron suggested we put the rear assembly, engine block, and radiator frame back together and mount the front axle and wheels so the tractor could be winched onto a trailer. Since the rear tires were dismounted from the wheels, I brought the wheels home to clean and paint and Ron took the tires on his trailer to drop off at Cal Poly later so they can be mounted. The front wheels and tires were mounted so I brought them home to paint also, and Ron took the front axle home to get the hubs to turn freely. After Larry's fun day, we will go back to Gil's to start reassembling the tractor so it can be moved. I will keep you up to date on progress of the restoration.

Treasurer	Kelley Garcia absent; furnished the banking report as follows: November figures for investment savings account report a balance at \$43,358.17, museum fund at \$144,414.99, total investments at \$187,773.16, with an adjusted profit/loss of \$52,176.82. The checking account as of Dec. 1 is at \$3,676.63.
Membership	Jim Davis furnished report as follows: total membership at 176, 13% of membership already paid for 2018. Jim asked that membership be paid by mail or by Paypal, if possible. Barbara Hale has been moved to life membership.
Purchasing	Lance Wilson had WAPA logos printed up, for sale at a buck each. Shirts and hats for sale.
Show Director	Rob Skinner absent. Gunther's Yard is on Sunday, Dec. 3, and the WAPA Winter Bash in Chino is on Saturday, Jan.. 13, 2018.
Library	Joe Siddons had nothing new to report.
Safety	Director Don Young said that all looked good safety-wise and had no issues to report.
Museum	Director Bob Smith said, in reference to our new museum home; when Weeks Roses moves out, we move in. He expressed a desire to complete the construction of the Aeromotor windmill in the near future.
Editor	Carol Haskell welcomes new articles, stories, ads, etc. and needs articles of interest for inclusion in the newsletter, and extends her thanks for the recent articles submitted. Director Bob Smith presented to Carol a Nordstrom's gift certificate on behalf of the Club in gratitude for her efforts.
Cal Poly	President Haskell and Craig Walters expressed their thanks to all those who helped make the Pumpkin Festival a huge success. Several more tractors have been moved from Larry Madole's place to the tractor shed and the hay wagons are undergoing repair.
Riverside Citrus Grove Project	Ron Haskell and crew have been at work paneling some more of the inside of the building. Bids have been submitted by the Park for the remaining concrete work inside along with replacement of the roll-up door and the addition of a man door in the side of the building. Bringing city water supply to the site is also under consideration.
Unfinished Business	Don Young has donated various items to WAPA that will need to be picked up at his property in Pearblossom with Saturday, Dec. 16 at 9:30 AM having been decided upon.
