ROCK ISLAND PLOW COMPANY Part 2: LeRoy's Engine

LeRoy has had his eye on this engine every time Larry Madole hosted a parts exchange at his yard in Chino. Finally they both came to an agreement on price and Larry He started with the crankshaft. The crankshaft was in good shape and there was no sign of wear on the main bearings. The flywheels were straight with no wobble. The The piston and connecting rod were reinstalled without changing bearings or rings.

The speed control lever that rides on a cone shaped cylinder on the crankshaft was

sold the engine to LeRoy with one stipulation: the engine must never be painted. LeRoy agreed to the terms and took the engine home to begin the restoration process.

He began by removing the buildup of grease, oil, and dirt. He scraped, brushed, and wiped for two weeks until all of the barn fresh dirt

was removed. He had to remove the head to thoroughly clean the dirt and rust from around the cylinder in the water hopper.

LeRoy could now see that there were no parts missing and everything appeared to be original. Now it was time to inspect the parts for signs of breakage or wear.




piston was free but LeRoy discovered that the connecting rod had a slight bow which caused the piston to bind on the compression stroke. He took the connecting rod to a machine shop where they created a jig and straightened it with a press as close to straight as possible. LeRoy took his mig welder and built up the worn area with weld and ground it into shape with his Dremel grinder. The pushrod guide at the head end was also badly worn so out came the welder again to build up the worn area and

worn area and cleaned up with the hand grinder. This is a good example of what

you can do without a machine shop.

While LeRoy had the head off he discovered that it had been broken on the side from freeze damage and repaired. He said the repair job was very good.





The fuel system was cleaned and reassembled with minor repairs. The fuel pump was in need of a new plunger so Tom Millett came through with a "G" Job.

After LeRoy finished reassembling the Rock Island, he discovered that the Wizard magneto was missing the magnets. In order to get the engine running, he rigged up a spark plug with battery and coil as a temporary fix. The engine fired on the third pull of the flywheels. This was the first time this engine has run in probably 50 years. LeRoy says he had been looking for an engine like this one for several years. It's just big enough to easily take to shows but not too big that it would be difficult to load and unload. Come out to one of our shows and see this beautiful engine.
